Wave Good-bye To Wedding Woes - 'MC of the Year' Saves the Day.

"The same goes for tacky mother-in-law jokes. Any MC who has developed their own style should not need to resort to such banal attempts to create amusement. Weddings are an uplifting occasion and should provide an opportunity for everyone to have a good time."

Along with modern jokes, non-discriminatory one-liners, and telegrams, the book also provides tips, templates, tricks and checklists to turn anyone from a hassled Harry to a slick Steve.

Miller entered the wedding industry through sheer frustration. He attended a wedding and was embarrassed by the foul-mouthed MC up front and out of control. He could see the guests felt ill at ease.

Miller remembers, "The amateur MC was so clueless that the groom apologised for him. It was excruciating and the friendship between the two people was fractured forever. I decided then and there that it should never happen again".

And so the secrets of a great Wedding MC have now been revealed. From good grooming (excuse the pun) to engaging the audience's attention (excuse the pun) to giving a toast, there are stacks of ideas on how to handle noisy crowds and nervous speakers.

So, for Pete's (Miller's) sake, do not let another wedding reception get side-tracked by the MC's jumbled jokes and viscous velour bow ties.
